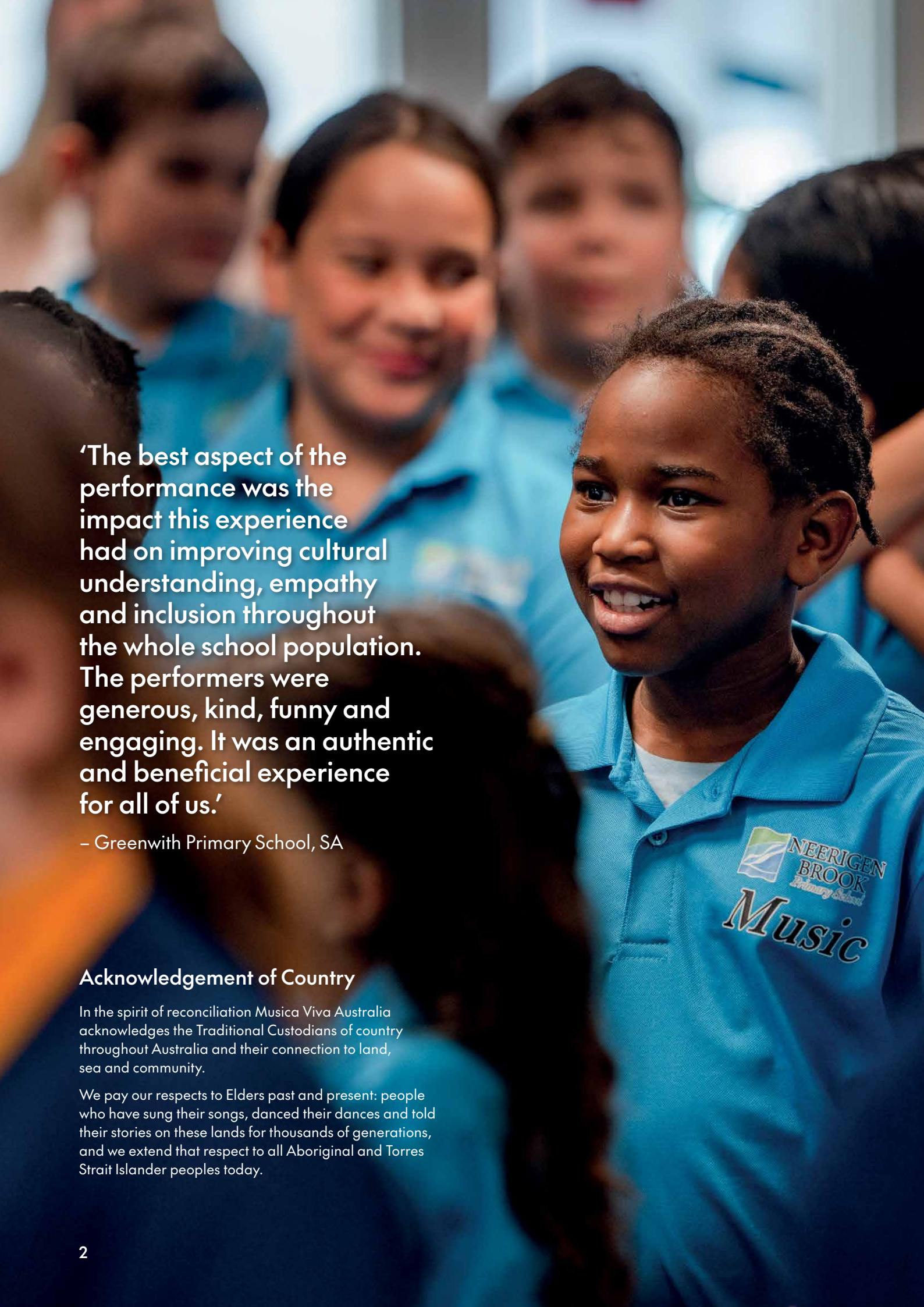

Music changes how children think, feel, and connect. Since 1981, the Musica Viva Australia Education Program has brought that belief into classrooms nationwide; nurturing creativity, building cultural understanding, and helping students discover a lifelong relationship with music.

The 2027 Education Program offers a full year of opportunities designed to engage, educate, and inspire. Australia’s finest musicians travel directly into schools to deliver culturally diverse, interactive performances. Musica Viva Australia in Schools reaches more than 130,000 students through live in-school shows. Every booking includes at least a term’s worth of curriculum-aligned teaching resources, developed for both general classroom teachers and specialist music educators so the impact of each performance extends well beyond the show itself.

Thousands of teachers across the country are supported through our Education Resource Platform, professional development workshops, online webinars, and the specialised 12-week Music Education Skills for the Primary Classroom course which helps to build teacher confidence and capability so music can thrive in every classroom.

Musica Viva Australia’s Music Education Residency program takes this further still, embedding immersive, multi-year music learning in select schools across the country. Through active music-making and sustained capacity-building, these residencies help schools develop lasting music programs that grow with their communities.

In 2027, that reach continues to expand into more schools, more communities, and more students across Australia. Because every child deserves access to the social, developmental, and educational benefits that quality music education provides.

Where cultures connect

Featuring a dynamic trio of multi-instrumentalists, Back to the Roots is a captivating exploration of where music comes from; and where it can go.

Combining traditional instruments such as the guzheng (traditional Chinese plucked zither) and mridangam (double-sided hand drum), the ensemble weaves together diverse musical influences to create a sound that is fresh, distinctive and deeply personal. The show also features *konnakol* – the South Indian art of vocal percussion; offering students a fascinating insight into the rhythmic language and traditions of Carnatic music.

Rich in texture and storytelling, Back to the Roots celebrates the power of music to shape and share who we are.

A journey into culture and music

El Camino (“The Journey”) celebrates the music of the performers’ Latin American heritage alongside musical influences from their home in culturally vibrant Western Sydney. Hear songs in ancient languages, performed with traditional instruments like the zampoñas (traditional Andean pan-flute), charango (10-string guitar) and bombo (cow-hide drum), as the musicians share the heart and soul of their cultures.

Students will engage in interactive learning by playing percussion instruments, singing in language, and moving to captivating rhythms. El Camino shines a light on the richness of our immigrant cultures and celebrates the power of music to unite and inspire us all.

Of Japanese, Taiwanese and Singaporean heritage, the musicians of Life is an Echo draw on their diverse backgrounds to share the rich traditions of Asian music. Performing on erhu, guzheng, and a range of percussion instruments, they create a sound world in this meditative and immersive show.

Exploring concepts of mindful listening, form and structure, and the many ways in which sound and silence can be represented and notated for performance, students will be invited to reflect on the power of tone and silence, learning how music can help create space for themselves and others. Meditative, reflective, and deeply engaging, Life is an Echo invites students to pause, listen, and consider how music can create space for creativity, connection and reflection.

Rhythm Works

Creating with percussion

Rhythm Works is a dynamic percussion duo who bring rhythm to life through energy, creativity and imagination. In this high-energy performance, students explore how percussion can be used to create vivid musical imagery – from lizards and waterfalls, to road trains and bustling carnivals.

Featuring a wide range of percussion instruments, including African djembes, marimbas, electronic loop machines, Boomwhackers and invented wearable instruments made from PVC pipe, students are introduced to concepts such as ostinato, syncopation and programmatic composition. Rhythm Works inspires students to experiment with percussion to create their own musical stories and imagery in the classroom and beyond.

Where the rhythm goes

Music moves — across borders, between people, and through time.

In this interactive show, students discover how music connects us all. Roads We Travel brings together percussion, strings, and woodwinds in a vibrant exploration of global musical traditions. Inspired by folk and regional music from across the world, the performance celebrates creativity, collaboration, and the joy of making music together.

From body percussion and call-and-response to shared rhythms and group improvisation, students are invited to actively take part in the show — no instruments required. Along the way, they'll learn about the core elements of music, all brought to life through storytelling, movement and musical connection.

Water Rhythms

Rhythm, water and movement

Be enchanted by the rhythm and flow of water in this dynamic performance where music, movement and visual storytelling come together in an immersive exploration of sound and motion.

Through the powerful traditions of Japanese *taiko* drumming, students are introduced to Taiko instruments and the vocal percussion system of *kuchi shōga*, discovering how rhythm can be learned, remembered and expressed through voice, body and instrument. Students will explore how sound and dance are deeply connected, learn body percussion activities, movement and memory games, and rhythm and soundscaping concepts.

This highly immersive show encourages students to connect rhythm and motion, sparking new ways of thinking about music, dance and self-expression.

In this entertaining and vibrant performance, students are introduced to the music and traditions of the Torres Strait, exploring how song, dance and games help keep cultural knowledge alive across generations.

Featuring traditional instruments such as the marap, warup, thoeram, and kulap, students will discover the rich visual and sound world of the Torres Strait. By comparing their own childhood games to those from the Torres Strait, students come to understand the importance of traditions, and to be thankful to those who teach them.

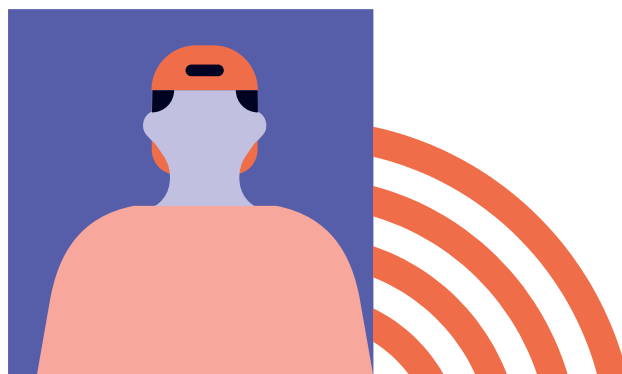

The Musica Viva Australia Music Education Residency Program focuses on individual schools, typically located in areas of socio-economic disadvantage. This three-year immersive program is designed to support the implementation of a comprehensive and effective music education program.

By providing select schools with a professional teaching artist, live music performances, tailored learning resources and instruments, the program supports schools to develop the skills and confidence to have agency over program delivery. Ongoing support and experiential learning is then provided through the Musica Viva Australia In Schools program including access to a portfolio of free professional development and digital learning resources.

We work with primary schools to ensure that music education becomes an integral part of the school’s culture ensuring that generations of children receive the educational and intrinsic benefits of a quality music education.

In 2026, the program delivered 10 Music Education Residencies across Perth, Adelaide, Melbourne and Sydney — comprising 451 residency days and engaging more than 2,024 students. We are proud to work with culturally and linguistically diverse school communities, as well as schools supporting students with additional access needs, ensuring that quality music education reaches those who need it most.

Professional Development

Musica Viva Australia's Education program provides teachers professional development opportunities to support their teaching of music education in Australian schools. Teachers can attend face-to-face and online workshops – many of them offered free of charge – that are designed for both general classroom and music specialist teachers across all states and territories.

All professional development workshops are curriculum aligned to the relevant State music syllabus and aligned to AITSL Professional Standards for Teachers.

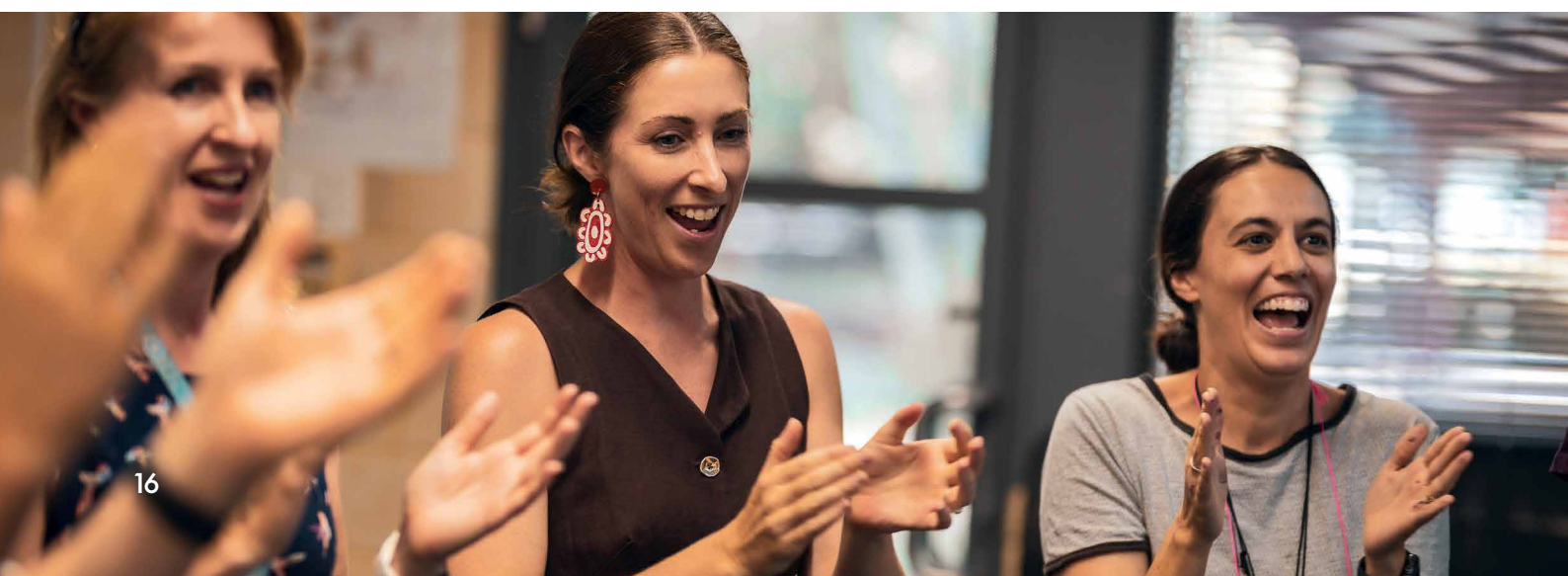

Music Education Skills for the Primary Classroom

Music Education Skills for the Primary Classroom is a 12-week online course aimed at generalist classroom teachers with minimal music teaching experience wishing to build their skills and confidence in teaching music in the primary classroom.

Facilitated by an experienced music educator providing ongoing and direct feedback throughout, participants will gain practical skills and creative ideas for use in the classroom. Across five self-paced modules, participants will engage with

- Key musical terminology and high-quality classroom video examples
- Lesson planning with templates and video examples created by MVA
- Interactive quizzes and reflection tasks

The content is fully aligned to the music syllabus relevant to each State and to the Australian Professional Standard for Teachers. By the end of the course, you'll have practical skills, a refined lesson planning framework, and the confidence to make music a meaningful part of your classroom.

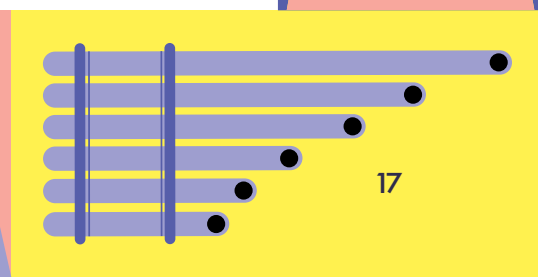
